

One-Pot Chicken Harvest Stew

Serves: 3 Est. cost: \$9.30 Est. cost per serving: \$3.10

Ingredients:

- 2 tbsp cooking oil (e.g. olive, canola)
- 1 each onion, finely chopped
- 2 cloves garlic, minced
- 2 large potatoes, diced
- 2 cups vegetable broth
- 1 can (15 oz) carrots, drained and rinsed
- 1 tsp thyme, dry
- 1 tsp rosemary, dry
- Salt and pepper, to taste
- 1 can (15 oz) peas, drained and rinsed
- 1 can (12.5 oz) chicken, drained and shredded
- Optional garnish: Fresh parsley, chopped

Equipment: Large pot (with lid), wooden spoon, knife cutting board and measuring spoons

Directions:

- 1. In a large pot, heat the cooking oil over medium heat. Add onions and cook until
- Add garlic and potatoes to the pot. Stir and sauté for about 5 minutes until the potatoes start to brown.
- 3. Pour in the vegetable broth, carrots, thyme, and rosemary. Season with salt and pepper, to taste.
- 4. Bring the mixture to a boil, then reduce the heat to low, cover, and let it simmer for about 15-20 minutes or until the potatoes are tender.
- 5. Add the peas and shredded chicken to the pot. Cook for an additional 5 minutes until the peas are heated through, and the chicken is warmed.
- 6. Taste and adjust seasoning if necessary. Garnish with fresh parsley if desired.
